Letter of Interest for Community Based Organization (CBO) Representative Membership on the Sonoma County Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC)

Welfare and Institution Code section 749.22 requires each county to establish a juvenile justice coordinating council (JJCC) that shall oversee the development and implementation of a continuum of county-based responses to juvenile crime. The JJCC is responsible for developing the county's Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan to prevent entry into Juvenile Justice System effectively serve juvenile-justice involved youth and assure a balanced and effective Juvenile Justice Continuum.

The JJCC shall include representatives from local nonprofit CBOs, including a representative from a drug and alcohol program. Appointed CBOs may select one (1) representative to attend JJCC meetings as a voting member on behalf of the organization. JJCC members are expected to attend quarterly meetings and participate as a committee member if assigned to one of the committees. Attendance of the voting member does not preclude other individuals from the organization from attending the meeting.
